BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS MAY 11-16, 2020

Monday - Acts 17:1-12 The Apostle Paul enjoyed clarifying that Jesus and Messiah were identical—a revelation that enlightened many Bible-believers (1-4). Satan wasn't on vacation, however (5), so the plot thickens. Paul and Silas were placed into a safe hide-out; a few days later they were obliged to leave town so their friends would not lose the "bail" they had posted (6-9). Moving along—the behavior of the Berea Christians has become the model for Bible-believing, God-pleasing Christians ever since; praise the Lord!

Tuesday - John 14:1-11 Jesus explained, clarified, and laid out the ABC's of divine truth, step by step. God is our Father (1), so His home has become our home (2), and all because of Jesus (3). Is this for sure (4-5)? Absolutely (6)! Review: What facts underlie/support the gospel truth (7-8)? The facts that God can't be two-faced (8-9) or fork-tongued (10-11). Simple ABC's.

Wednesday - 1 Peter 2:4-10 We are described as *living stones* because we are warm rather than stone-cold, we are lively rather than static, and we are loaded with the potential of uranium ore (4-5). God aligns us with Jesus and puts us into His building project (6-7). Of course, that frustrates Satan's crew, for wherever God is building His Church, Satan will try to sabotage (8). Dear friends, let's appreciate who we are: God's special children (9-10).


Thursday - Psalm 33 And let's sing our praises (1-3), for God has created our blue planet via the power of His Word (6-7). Further, everyone should realize that the LORD has jurisdiction over nations (10-11) and blesses those who revere Him (12). While God attends to humanity in general (13-15), He focuses on us in particular (18-19), and that's why we behave as God's children (20-22).

Friday - John 14:12-21 Jesus connects us with Himself so closely that we work as a team (12), He validates our petitions (13-14), and we pledge our loyalty (15). Jesus knows that we need a lot of help in our daily lives, so He supplies us with the heavenly Helper, who makes Himself at home in our hearts (16-17). What a privilege it is to provide housing for Jesus and His Spirit (20), and what a golden circle of love God has given us (21)! Praise the Lord!

Saturday - Acts 10:34-48 Peter was a good student and a good teacher of the lesson that God is fair and square with humans (34-35). Here's how Peter laid it out: God was generous with Jews, placing them at the head of the line to receive remission of sins via Jesus (36-43), and He has been equally generous with Gentiles. God proved His generosity by squaring accounts with everyone, regardless of their ethnic and/or racial heritage. When this truth impacts the human heart/soul, and confession is made unto salvation, such persons are received into God's family to enjoy fellowship (47-48).

STAY HOME, STAY SAFE EXTENDED

On Thursday May 7th, Governor Whitmer again extended the “Stay Home, Stay Safe” Executive Order through May 28th, 2020. While this extension has relaxed some of the social distancing features it still declares that ‘all public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring among persons not part of a single household...prohibited.’ After carefully reading the entire 17-page Executive Order No. 2020-77, it is noted that it says, (16. on Pg. 16):

“...neither a place of religious worship nor its owner is subject to penalty under section 20 [making the willful violation of Executive Order 2020-77 a misdemeanor] of this order for engaging in or traveling to engage in religious worship at a place of religious worship, or for violating section 15(a) of this order [requiring a face mask in any enclosed space].

We may decide to extend our postponement of public worship services in agreement with the spirit of Governor Whitmer’s order. If we were to resume services, it ought to be done with social distancing. Either way, as this order (and the former one) reads, you are free to make arrangements with the Pastor and come to the church for a devotion and private communion.

Council Members are asked to contact President Terry Weigold or Pastor Schaller to express their thoughts on the matter. Frankly, any church member may do so.

Once again, as before, written, audio and video sermons will be posted on the church website. This week Pastor Schaller will also again post online Bible Class. Check it out at: calvary.cclutheran.org. If you need a little technological instruction, contact Pastor. If you are in the Marquette Area and don’t have internet access, you drop by the church and have access to the Internet. Please contact Pastor Schaller for information.

ONLINE HOLY COMMUNION

The last time that we celebrated Holy Communion at Calvary was Sunday March 1st. In a number of cases, CLC congregations have arranged for online communion. Individual Bread/Wine packets have been ordered for this purpose. **However, since no one has expressed the desire to do so, Pastor Schaller has not done so. It appears that everyone wants to simply wait until corporate worship resumes to return to our celebration of the Lord’s Supper.**

ISAIAH 12:1-6

EPISTLE LESSON:

ACTS 5:17-25

¹⁷ Then the high priest rose up, and all those who *were* with him (which is the sect of the Sadducees), and they were filled with indignation, ¹⁸ and laid their hands on the apostles and put them in the common prison. ¹⁹ But at night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out, and said, ²⁰ “Go, stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this life.”

²¹ And when they heard *that*, they entered the temple early in the morning and taught. But the high priest and those with him came and called the council together, with all the elders of the children of Israel, and sent to the prison to have them brought.

²² But when the officers came and did not find them in the prison, they returned and reported, ²³ saying, “Indeed we found the prison shut securely, and the guards standing outside before the doors; but when we opened them, we found no one inside!” ²⁴ Now when the high priest, the captain of the temple, and the chief priests heard these things, they wondered what the outcome would be.

²⁵ So one came and told them, saying, "Look, the men whom you put in prison are standing in the temple and teaching the people!" *
