

## BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS JUNE 15-20, 2020

**Monday - Deuteronomy 11:18-21,26-28** The Hebrews were ruled by God without political posturing, facile legislators, venal judiciary, etc., etc. What became of all those blessings? They were lost when adults didn't respect God and His Word in the family circle, and that's how their nation became foolish enough to invite God's curse. Humans are born blind, deaf, and dumb—and unless enlightened by God's Spirit will stay that way. Lord, have mercy!


**Tuesday - Matthew 7:15-29** What makes for a false prophet? A false prophet arises when he misrepresents God and His Word, weaning souls away from God's theology into all manner of error and false security. We stand guard against such clergymen and don't nibble on their fruit (teachings). But how can we identify them? Jesus expects us to identify them by their teachings (fruits). God expects us to steer clear of them, but He does not expect us to declare their ultimate fate, for that's in His own hands.

**Wednesday - Romans 3:21-25a, 27-28** Our standing with God is based on His amazing grace. God is not impressed with human "good conduct" (23), so He discards it and brings in His own Son Jesus to fill the gap (21-25). That maneuver pulls the rug out from under all human bragging rights (27), and since Jesus has done enough to justify all humanity, God invites all to depend on Jesus.

**Thursday - Psalm 78** is the Reader's Digest version of about 1700 years of Jewish history—presented from God's viewpoint, of course. God responded to rebellion with grace and mercy – over and over. So then, Jewish history is a parable, a case-book illustration of human infidelity and cheating on God —which God swallowed (with a lump in His throat) and turned the other cheek. God is so good! God is so gracious! Trinity God is so awesome!

**Friday - Matthew 10:16-22** We rely on Jesus' good judgment that life for faithful Christians is not going to be easy; that judgment held true in Jesus' day, and it holds true in our day. Christians (mostly in foreign lands) are slandered, cheated, and persecuted—as we learn via the internet and our missionaries. If and when that happens in the USA, how will we conduct ourselves? God grant that we hold fast to our Savior and confession of His truth! *He who endures to the end shall be saved.* Hallelujah!

**Saturday - Acts 12:1-17** There have been many tyrants in the world, but this one set the bar: Herod harassed God's people and enjoyed it. He butchered James and enjoyed it. He victimized Peter and enjoyed it. Then God stepped in and with a flick of the wrist freed Peter from prison to rejoin his friends. Bottom line: God has His way of rescuing His children from their oppressors, and the way He does it is surprisingly easy. Efficient. Dramatic. Stay tuned.

## A FEW NOTIFICATIONS AND 'COMMON SENSE' REQUESTS

- 1) If you don't feel well, feel weak or have a fever, please stay home...whether you 'think' you have the virus or you 'think' you have something else. This is really common sense. As before, you can call Pastor for an in-home visit.
- 2) Please make an effort (for the time being) to keep a six-foot distance from those not in your immediate family (with whom you have been living the last two months).
- 3) A face mask is not necessary (per the Governor's Executive Order 2020-92, Part 16) but if you feel compelled to wear one, you may do so...especially if coughing.
- 4) The Offerings will be received on the table in the fellowship hall. Please simply place your offerings in the plate on the back table.
- 5) After worship please file out at the direction of the ushers. No one is trying to curtail your fellowship time, only to allow others to depart should they feel the desire to do so without having to wait for a gaggle of people - blocking the way out - to disperse.
- 6) Pastor Schaller will not be shaking hands for the time being (as much as He would like to). It's not because he's afraid of getting the virus from you. It's more a concern about passing it on to others.
- 7) If you stay behind to visit after worship (which you may certainly do) please practice 'social distancing' (stay at least six feet apart).
- 8) If you do come down with the virus (meaning you have the test administered, not self-diagnosis), please do let the rest of us know so that we can look for symptoms in ourselves.
- 9) On Communion Sundays we will use sealed, single servings which will be placed on the far back table in the fellowship hall. Please pick up your serving before the service to be distributed during the service. If you wish not to use these, please request private communion of Pastor Schaller.
- 10) Our online services will continue to be posted for the foreseeable future. However, online services won't be posted until later on Sunday afternoon or evening and will not be as extensive.
- 11) If you use one of the church hymnals (rather than the hymn insert) please leave the hymnal on the cushion so it can be sanitized.

## MICHIGANDERS ARE NO LONGER REQUIRE TO STAY HOME

Governor Whitmer's Executive Order No. 2020-96 has been replaced with Executive Order 2020-110 (June 1). This order declares that citizens of Michigan are no longer required to stay at home. Certain businesses remain closed and specific activities. As in the previous Executive Order, "No individual is subject to penalty...for engaging in religious worship at a place of religious worship, or for violating the face covering requirement of...the order."

If you are sick or feel weak or are uncomfortable attending worship with social distancing measures, you may remain at home. Written, audio and video sermons will be posted on the church website.
