A REVIEW OF GOD'S GRACE TO MILTON WILLIAM JOHNS THE SCRIPTURE READINGS

On Saturday July 16 1966, Milton married Patricia Lois Priebe Roy at St. Paul's Lutheran Church at Green Garden, by then Pastor Bertram J. Naumann. God blessed Milt and Pat with three children; David, Mary, and Cynthia.

Milton became a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, where he served on the church council and as President. When it became necessary because of conscience to remove their membership from St. Paul's Lutheran, Milton served in a leadership role as President of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. Good Shepherd became part of Calvary Lutheran Church, where Milton continued to serve in a number of different roles.

The Savior Jesus strengthened Milton's faith through Word and Sacrament received joyfully at Calvary Lutheran Church in Marquette, Michigan. Milton also served the community as a Volunteer Fireman, serving as Fire Chief for many years until his retirement. When Milton wasn't involved in helping others, home renovation or car maintenance, he spent his time traveling by way of airplane, ship or RV; he's visited Japan, cruised the Caribbean, and driven his RV to Washington DC, Florida, New Mexico, California, and all states in between. When back home in the UP, you would find him either camping, playing cribbage, bowling or working on crossword puzzles. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The earthly life of a child of God is never easy this side of heaven, and Milton was not immune from sickness and sorrow. For a number of years, he underwent treatment for a form of cancer. He kept an upbeat spirit during the COVID-19 pandemic, attending worship when possible. Milton received hospice care from Lake Superior Hospice.

Milton William Johns lived a life full of blessings on this earth for 90 years, 8 months and 21 days. He awaits the glorious reappearing of the Savior Jesus when by God's grace through faith in Christ, he will enter eternal life in both soul and body.

Milton is preceded in death by his parents, William and Florence Johns; a sister, June Adelaide Johns Depetro and brother Paul Leonard Johns (Jean); as well as other friends and acquaintances.

On Tuesday, September 23rd 1930, God blessed William John Johns and his wife Florence Dagmar (Olson) Johns with the gift of a baby boy, Milton William. Milton was born in Houghton, Michigan, the third child and first son with which God blessed William and Florence. Milton's other siblings include June, Shirley, Paul and Dorothy. After Milton was born, the family moved to Ramsey, Michigan and then to Michigamme, where he grew up. He attended the Bethlehem Swedish Lutheran Church in Michigamme.

The LORD Jesus in mercy washed away Milton's sins and made him a child of God and heir with Christ when he was baptized by Pastor E.F. Brandt in Houghton Michigan on January 27th, 1931.

Milton grew up in Michigamme, Michigan where he would graduate in 1948. After graduating from Michigamme High School, Milton moved to the Detroit Area where he worked briefly for a Lathing Company before being drafted into the Army to serve during the Korean Conflict. After serving his country for 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, Milton was honorably discharged in California and made his way back home to Michigamme.

Milton took a job in St. Paul Minnesota putting up storefronts for two to three years before returning to the UP, to Marquette, where he was employed by Cliff Dow for 14 years. After working for Cliff Dow, Milton worked for Cleveland Cliffs Incorporated in the Eagle Mills, Mather B. and Empire Mine. He retired while working at the Empire Mine.
