READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS MARCH 9-14, 2020

Monday - Genesis 12:1-8 Eleven generations after the Flood, Jehovah selected Abram for a special purpose that would change the world. It meant leaving family ties and heathen surroundings behind (1), so God assured Abram he would gain great blessings (2-3). Abram and Sarai packed up, walked 400+ miles overland to Palestine, Canaanite country (4-6). What next? God told him; Abram's response was so positive that he built worship centers in heathen Canaan . . . to honor Jehovah. Good public relations for Jehovah!

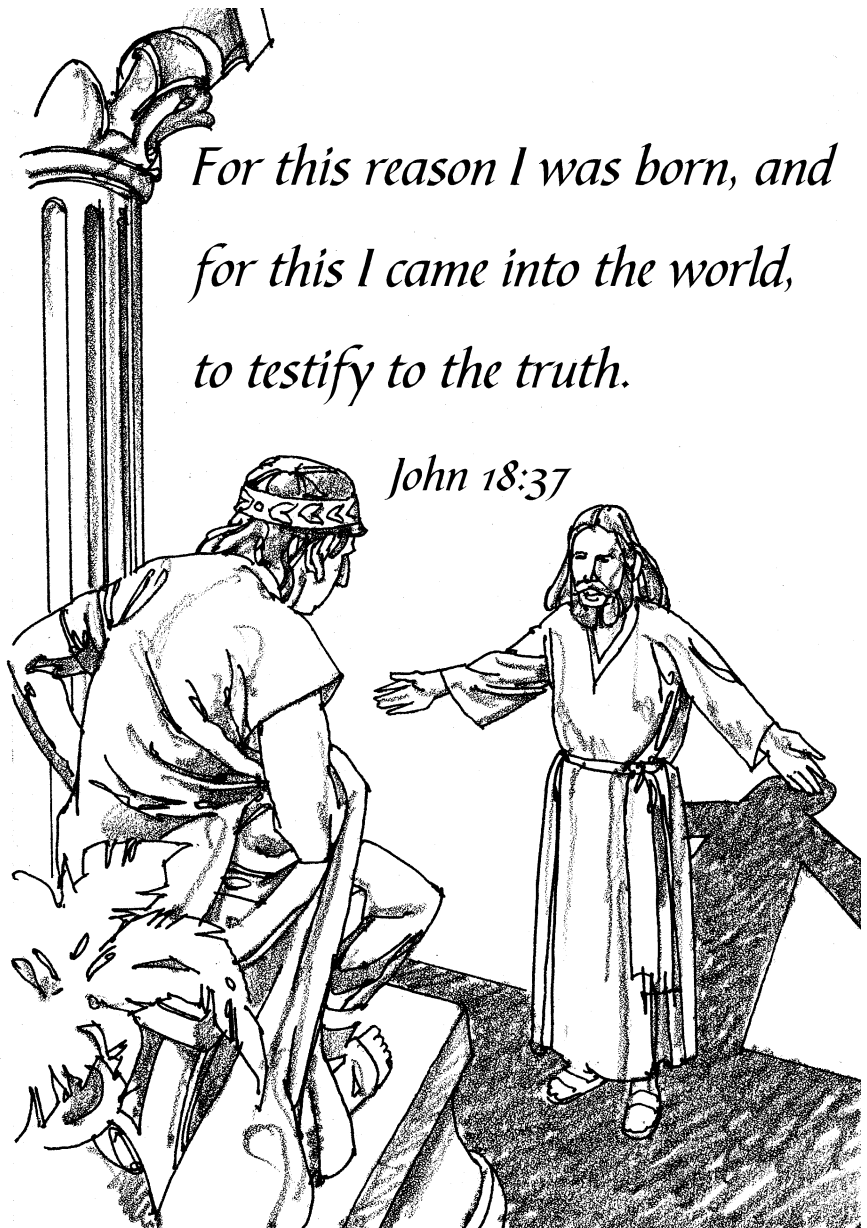
Tuesday - John 4:5-26 In His search-and-rescue mission, Jesus hiked around the land of Palestine; He found a woman whose Bible knowledge was murky, so He clarified. She suffered from a soiled life-style (17-18) as well as from a muddled concept of true religion, so Jesus clarified those for her also. Bottom line: Jesus found her, stirred her soul, and introduced her to God's religion.

Wednesday - Romans 4:1-5,13-17 There are only two religions: God's religion and the human religion. What's the human religion? Try to impress God with your good behavior. (God is not impressed.) What is God's religion? Save humans without their help. Abraham appreciated God's religion and depended on God to save humans. (That's what saving faith is all about.) Amen!

Thursday - Psalm 121 God puts His religion into practice—that is, He pities us and loves to come to our aid. He is strong (1-2), stays awake (3-4), puts us into His holy circle (5-6), and preserves us from all evil as we travel through life. Repeat: "God is my Father, I am His child, and He loves me."

Friday - John 4:27-42 merits closer attention. Since water is essential to life, and since a bubbling spring produces pure water—Jesus is saying that He controls the well-spring essential to spiritual life. What is this spring water? It's God's Word, which the thirsty soul can imbibe and which the Spirit keeps bubbling inside hearts and souls from here to eternity. Jesus invites thirsty travelers to come to Him and drink the spring water of God's Word.

Saturday - Acts 9:1-9 Saul, the super Pharisee (Philippians 3:5-6), was victimized by Satan and misled to hunt down and punish Jews who had drunk the water of life from Jesus and His disciples. So Jesus had to set him straight. It took a miracle - - but then, every conversion is a miracle. Our strong God reached down, knocked Saul off his high horse, and took away his eyesight to render him utterly helpless. Such tough love was hard on Saul; he had no other choice but to surrender. For seventy-two hours he was too upset to eat because the evidence was unavoidable that he had been fighting against Jesus, enthroned in heaven and positively the authentic Messiah. What next? Would God knock him down with the other fist - - or lift him up? Stay tuned.

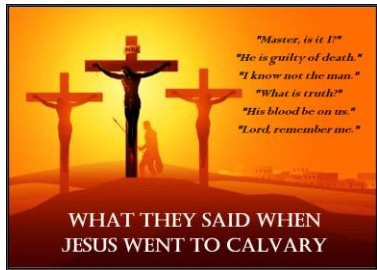

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON:

ISAIAH 45:20-25

²⁰ “Assemble yourselves and come; Draw near together, You *who have* escaped from the nations. They have no knowledge, Who carry the wood of their carved image, And pray to a god *that* cannot save. ²¹ Tell and bring forth *your case*; Yes, let them take counsel together. Who has declared this from ancient time? *Who* has told it from that time? *Have* not I, the LORD? And *there is* no other God besides Me, A just God and a Savior; *There is* none besides Me.

²² “Look to Me, and be saved, All you ends of the earth! For I *am* God, and *there is* no other. ²³ I have sworn by Myself; The word has gone out of My mouth *in* righteousness, And shall not return, That to Me every knee shall bow, Every tongue shall take an oath. ²⁴ He shall say, ‘Surely in the LORD I have righteousness and strength. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Confess *your* trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. ¹⁷ Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months. ¹⁸ And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth produced its fruit.

GOSPEL LESSON:

MARK 9:17-29

¹⁷ Then one of the crowd answered and said, "Teacher, I brought You my son, who has a mute spirit. ¹⁸ And wherever it seizes him, it throws him down; he foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth, and becomes rigid. So I spoke to Your disciples, that they should cast it out, but they could not."

¹⁹ He answered him and said, "**O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him to Me.**" ²⁰ Then they brought him to Him. And when he saw Him, immediately the spirit convulsed him, and he fell on the ground and wallowed, foaming at the mouth.

²¹ So He asked his father, "**How long has this been happening to him?**"

And he said, "From childhood. ²² And often he has thrown him both into the fire and into the water to destroy him. But if You can do anything, have compassion on us and help us."

²³ Jesus said to him, "**If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes.**"

²⁴ Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"

²⁵ When Jesus saw that the people came running together, He rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "**Deaf and dumb spirit, I command you, come out of him and enter him no more!**" ²⁶ Then *the spirit* cried out, convulsed him greatly, and came out of him. And he became as one dead, so that many said, "He is dead." ²⁷ But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose.

²⁸ And when He had come into the house, His disciples asked Him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?"

²⁹ So He said to them, "**This kind can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting.**" *
