BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS JUNE 1-6, 2020

Monday - Joel 2:12-20 Perhaps we need to spend more time with Joel, via whom God announced a plague that would destroy the economy. Our plague seems parallel in some ways, and it may bring many to their knees in repentance. *“Now, therefore,” says the LORD, rend your hearts, and return to the LORD your God (12-14).”* Everybody, get your act together (15-17), for only then will the LORD relent and keep the world going!

Tuesday - John 16:5-15 Jesus understood that humans are incapable of salvaging themselves by their own devices, so He took the initiative—at which God is good. It was the Pentecost initiative, whereby God’s Holy Spirit takes over, guiding humans into all truth, speaking with God’s voice to glorify Jesus as Savior from sin, death, and hell. 2020 pandemic world, listen up!

Wednesday - Acts 2:1-21 On Pentecost, 50 days after Easter, the Holy Spirit jolted twelve tongue-tied men to speak up for Jesus and moving them to go public (4). In a few hours the town was abuzz: *“What does this mean?”* (5-13). Somebody should step up and explain what it meant – so Peter did, choosing Joel 2:28-32 as his sermon text. Nobody in that audience would ever forget that sermon, for God moved hearts and minds to trust in Jesus.

Thursday - Joel 2:28-32 Back in Joel’s time, after the plague had done what God sent it to do, and following upon heartfelt repentance, God took the next step. Simply because humans are not godly by nature, God activates His Holy Spirit to work in the heart. Humanity today still **needs** God’s Pentecost Spirit, so that *whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved.*

Friday - Revelation 7:13-17 Sidebar: What is the *great tribulation* (literally, *the tribulation, the big one*) out of which the souls in heaven have come? As tribulations come and go on planet Earth, it could include the COVID-19 pandemic, but likely it includes everything that can be called tribulation: spiritual stresses, human frailties, societal disruptions, diseases, broken hearts and ruined lives—all rolled into one ball of *great tribulation*. Now, how did those souls escape? By washing/cleansing themselves in the blood of the Lamb, i.e., by the Holy Spirit bringing them around to God’s side.

Saturday - Acts 1:19-26 Although God placed orthodox Hebrews at the head of the line (19), Grecianized Jews were second in line, and the Spirit convinced them that Jesus was God’s Messiah (21). When the synod officials heard about this turn of events, they sent Barnabas to check it out (22). Barnabas saw the Lord’s hand in it, and his reputation as God’s spokesman grew (24-25) along with growth of the Church. It seemed the right time to get Saul on board (25) too, which was a good move (26). Let us praise the Holy Spirit!

A FEW NOTIFICATIONS AND 'COMMON SENSE' REQUESTS

- 1) ***If you don't feel well, feel weak or have a fever, please stay home...whether you 'think' you have the virus or you 'think' you have something else. This is really common sense. As before, you can call Pastor for an in-home visit.***
- 2) ***Please make an effort (for the time being) to keep a six-foot distance from those not in your immediate family (with whom you have been living the last two months).***
- 3) ***A face mask is not necessary (per the Governor's Executive Order 2020-92, Part 16) but if you feel compelled to wear one, you may do so...especially if coughing.***
- 4) ***Sunday School and Bible Class are out for the Summer (not because of Covid-19, but because they are out for the summer).***
- 5) ***The Offerings will be received on the table in the fellowship hall. Please simply place your offerings in the plate on the back table.***
- 6) ***After worship please file out at the direction of the ushers. No one is trying to curtail your fellowship time, only to allow others to depart should they feel the desire to do so without having to wait for a gaggle of people - blocking the way out - to disperse.***
- 7) ***Pastor Schaller will not be shaking hands for the time being (as much as He would like to). It's not because he's afraid of getting the virus from you. It's more a concern about passing it on to others.***
- 8) ***If you stay behind to visit after worship (which you may certainly do) please practice 'social distancing' (stay at least six feet apart).***
- 9) ***If you do come down with the virus (meaning you have the test administered, not self-diagnosis), please do let the rest of us know so that we can look for symptoms in ourselves.***
- 10) ***On Sunday, June 7th our worship may include Holy Communion, with some changes for social distancing. We will use sealed personal host/wine servings. Those servings will be spread out on the tables in the fellowship hall and each communicant is to pick up their own personal serving to be distributed during the service. If you wish not to use these, please request private communion of Pastor Schaller.***
- 11) ***Our online services will continue May 24th and will continue to be posted for the foreseeable future. Once face-to-face services have resumed, the online services won't be posted until later on Sunday afternoon and may not be as extensive.***
- 12) ***If you use one of the church hymnals (rather than the hymn insert) please leave the hymnal on the cushion so it can be sanitized.***

STAY HOME, STAY SAFE – EXTENDED TO JUNE 12

On Thursday May 21st, Governor Whitmer extended the "Stay Home, Stay Safe" Executive Order through June 12th 2020. It is noted, once again, that the 13-page Executive Order No. 2020-96, does not forbid religious services, (16. on Pg. 12):

"...neither a place of religious worship nor its owner is subject to penalty under section 20 [making the willful violation of Executive Order 2020-77 a misdemeanor] of this order for engaging in or traveling to engage in religious worship at a place of religious worship, or for violating section 15(a) of this order [requiring a face mask in any enclosed space].

After discussing the matter, the Calvary Council has decided to resume face to face worship with the implementation of 'social distancing' and with the requests listed in the bulletin.

As before, written, audio and video sermons will be posted on the church website. If you want or need a little technological instruction, contact Pastor. If you are in the Marquette Area and don't have internet access, you drop by the church and have access to the Internet. Please contact Pastor Schaller for information.
