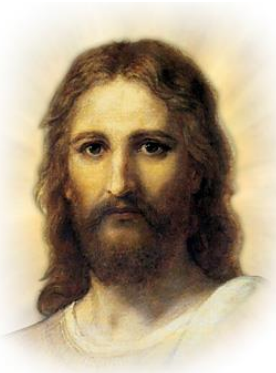

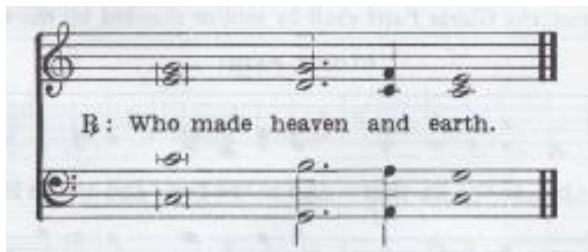

HOME DEVOTIONS FOR JUNE 14-19, 2021

Monday - Genesis 3:8-15 Adam hid in the bushes, for he was ashamed of himself. When God pressed him to confess and repent, he played the blame-game, and so did Eve. Satan had ruined God's dear children, but One greater than Satan thwarted Satan's game-plan by putting Jesus between us and Satan (15). We love Him who first loved us; thank You, dear Lord Jesus.

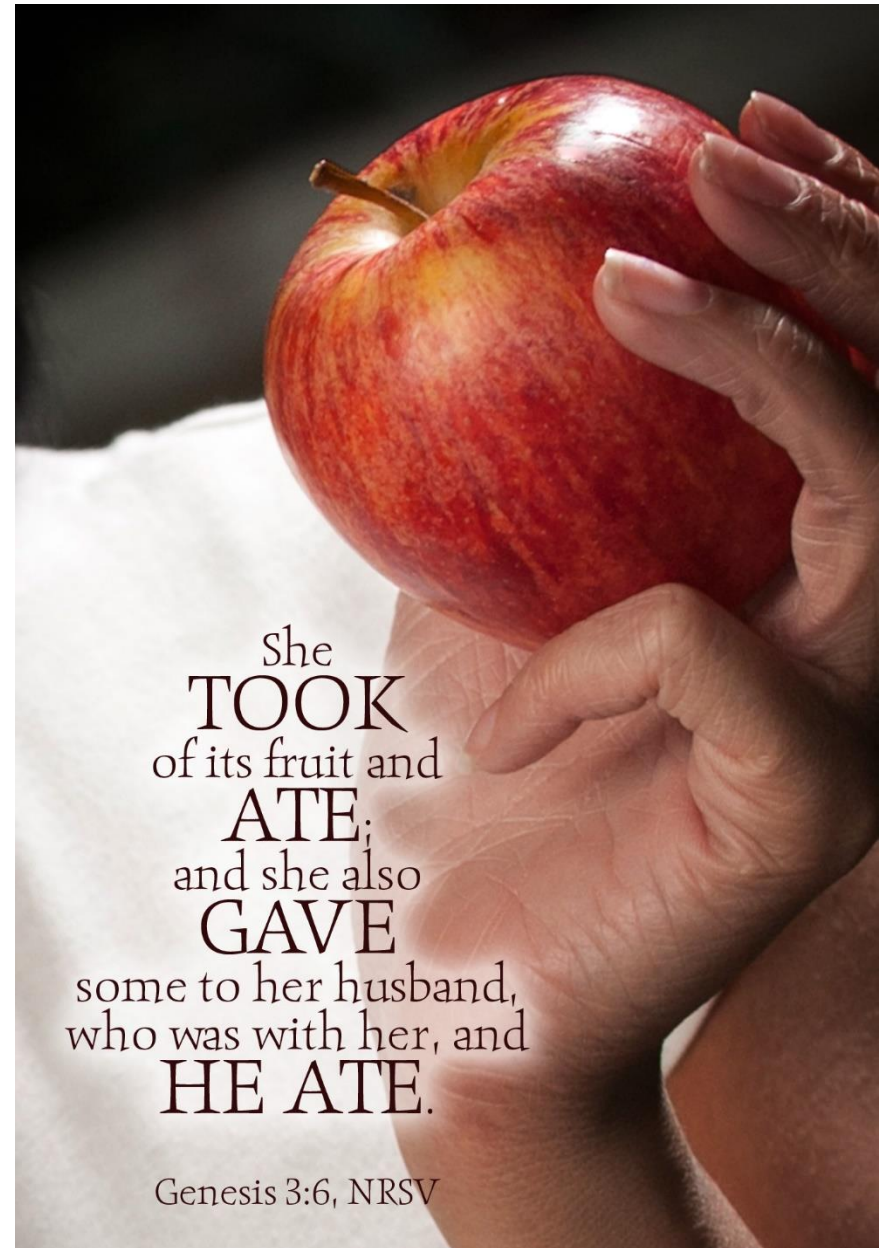
Tuesday - Mark 3:20-35 Jesus didn't need buffers, for He was fully capable of defending Himself – with logic that was right-on (23-27). [Bad-mouthing Jesus is the same as bad-mouthing the Holy Spirit (28-30).] When His relatives tried to take Him home, He chose to remain with His spiritual family. Bottom line: One's blood relatives must come in second-best to God's family.

Wednesday - 2 Corinthians 4:13-18 We trust God to treat us as He treated Jesus (13-14); *therefore we do not lose heart* (no matter how stressful life can get) because we know God is following His own recipe for our blessing. IOW, we overlook the stuff that's temporary and focus on blessings that are eternal.

Thursday - Psalm 51:1-6 We know the drill: Don't face God until you face yourself; if you can't (or won't) face up to your cheating on God and your fellowmen, don't ask God to be nice. We are derelicts because we were born that way (5), and we are on a learning curve spiritually. For all these reasons we throw ourselves on God's mercy—which means we go to the foot of the Cross.

Friday - Luke 8:22-25 We feel the sting of Jesus' question: "*Where is your faith?*" Do we come to Jesus only after we have gotten too exhausted to do anything else? Jesus ought not be our last resort – but our ally in all of life's difficulties. Let's not be backward about "awakening" Him to our problems; He has put Himself into the same boat with us – to share our difficult times and to use His powerful influence to calm our troubled waters.

Saturday - Acts 27:13-38 The tensions were mounting for crew and passengers; their cargo/passenger vessel was being blown every which way, day and night, for two weeks; they were half-starved, sea-sick, groggy from lack of sleep, and they needed HELP. Paul knew God would rescue them in His own good time and in the best way (21-26) – as long as nobody cheated (27-32). God was teaching 276 people a good lesson, and they seemed to be catching on (35-38) that when you are facing death, it's high time to throw your excess baggage overboard and lighten yourself for the swim to safety. [That is, throw your burden of sins into the sea of God's forgiveness, and use Jesus as your life-jacket to carry you safely to the shore of eternal salvation.] Lord, have mercy upon us; Christ, have mercy upon us; Lord, have mercy upon us! Amen.

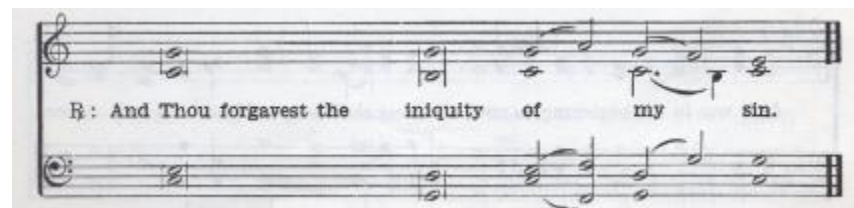

GLDC – FOND DU LAC, WISCONSIN

Pastor Schaller left early this past Monday morning for the Great Lakes Delegate Conference in Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin (Calvary is a member congregation of the Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC) and also part of the Great Lakes Conference within the CLC). The Delegate Conference is attended by all the Pastors of the Great Lakes Conference (Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois) as well as delegates from each congregation in the conference. The Delegate Conference covered the material in the Prospectus, the matters that will come before the CLC Convention in Eau Claire, Wisconsin later this month (June 24-27).

There was also a presentation entitled: "Holding Up the Prophet's Hands" (Ideas for Supporting the Called Servants in Our Congregations by Pastor Rob Sauers of Luther Memorial in Fond du Lac.

Pastor Thomas Nauman of Mount Zion in Madison Heights (Detroit) delivered a paper entitled: Leaning into the Traditional Liturgy.

There was a Worship Service including Holy Communion on Monday evening with Pastor David Ude (Living Word, Appleton, WI) delivering the message from God's Word.

Pastor Caleb Schaller also delivered a paper entitled "How to Respond Evangelically to Accusations of Bigotry, Hatred, and Intolerance on Both a Congregational and Personal Level".

The next Great Lakes Delegate Conference was scheduled for June 6-7, 2022 at Messiah Lutheran in Hales Corners, Wisconsin. The following essays were assigned for that conference: The Youth are Our Future (Part One – Grade School, Teacher Seth Schaller; Part Two – High School, Professor Dan Schierenbeck); The Role of Men in the Church (Pastor Bruce Naumann); Preaching the Gospel in a Political World (Pastor Chad Seybt). 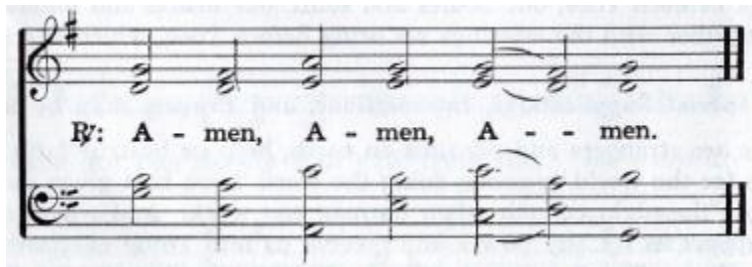

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON:

GENESIS 3:1-24

Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, “Has God indeed said, ‘You shall not eat of every tree of the garden?’”

² And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; ³ but of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God has said, ‘You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.’”

⁴ Then the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. ⁵ For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

⁶ So when the woman saw that the tree *was* good for food, that it *was* pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make *one* wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate. ⁷ Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they *were* naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings. ⁸ And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

¹⁵ And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel.”

¹⁶ To the woman He said: “I will greatly multiply your sorrow and your conception; In pain you shall bring forth children; Your desire *shall be* for your husband, And he shall rule over you.”

¹⁷ Then to Adam He said, “Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, ‘You shall not eat of it’: “Cursed *is* the ground for your sake; In toil you shall eat *of* it All the days of your life. ¹⁸ Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you, And you shall eat the herb of the field. ¹⁹ In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread Till you return to the ground, For out of it you were taken; For dust you *are*, And to dust you shall return.”

²⁰ And Adam called his wife’s name Eve, because she was the mother of all living. ²¹ Also for Adam and his wife the LORD God made tunics of skin, and clothed them.

²² Then the LORD God said, “Behold, the man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil. And now, lest he put out his hand and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live forever”—²³ therefore the LORD God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken.

²⁴ So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life. *

THE SERMON:

GENESIS 3:1-15

Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. THE SOURCE OF THE PROBLEM & THE SOLUTION

EPISTLE LESSON:

2 CORINTHIANS 4:1-18

Therefore, since we have this ministry, as we have received mercy, we do not lose heart.² But we have renounced the hidden things of shame, not walking in craftiness nor handling the word of God deceitfully, but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God.

³But even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing,⁴ whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, lest the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them.⁵ For we do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your bondservants for Jesus' sake.⁶ For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to *give* the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us.⁸ *We are* hard-pressed on every side, yet not crushed; *we are* perplexed, but not in despair;⁹ persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed—¹⁰always carrying about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body.¹¹ For we who live are always delivered to death for Jesus' sake, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh.¹² So then death is working in us, but life in you.

¹³And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "*I believed and therefore I spoke,*" we also believe and therefore speak,¹⁴ knowing that He who raised up the Lord Jesus will also raise us up with Jesus, and will present *us* with you.¹⁵ For all things *are* for your sakes, that grace, having spread through the many, may cause thanksgiving to abound to the glory of God.

¹⁶Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward *man* is being renewed day by day.¹⁷ For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding *and* eternal weight of glory,¹⁸ while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen *are* temporary, but the things which are not seen *are* eternal. *

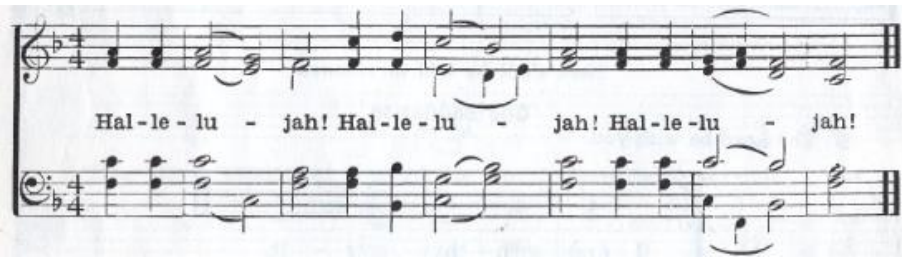

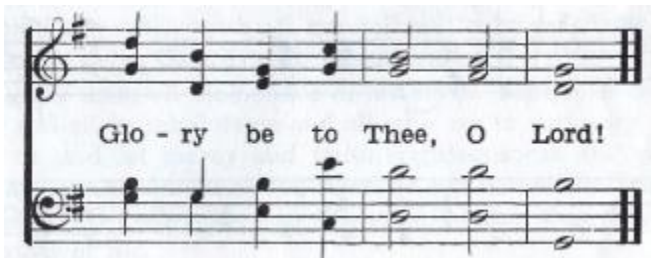

GOSPEL LESSON:

MARK 3:20-35

²⁰ Then the multitude came together again, so that they could not so much as eat bread. ²¹ But when His own people heard *about this*, they went out to lay hold of Him, for they said, "He is out of His mind."

[cf. also Matthew 12:24–32; Luke 11:17–23]

²² And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebub," and, "By the ruler of the demons He casts out demons."

²³ So He called them to *Himself* and said to them in parables: "How can Satan cast out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself, and is divided, he cannot stand, but has an end."

²⁷ No one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. And then he will plunder his house.

²⁸ "Assuredly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the sons of men, and whatever blasphemies they may utter; ²⁹ but he who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is subject to eternal condemnation"—³⁰ because they said, "He has an unclean spirit."

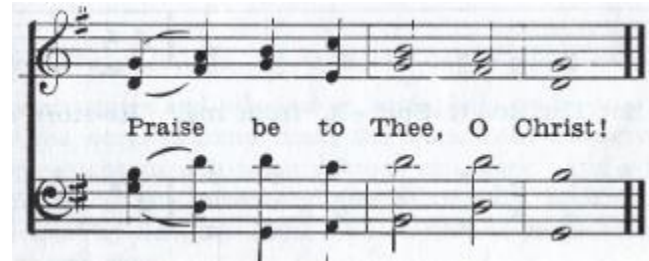

³¹ Then His brothers and His mother came, and standing outside they sent to Him, calling Him. ³² And a multitude was sitting around Him; and they said to Him, "Look, Your mother and Your brothers are outside seeking You."

³³ But He answered them, saying, "Who is My mother, or My brothers?"

³⁴ And He looked around in a circle at those who sat about Him, and said, "Here are My mother and My brothers! ³⁵ For whoever does the will of God is My brother and My sister and mother." *

¹² Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, And uphold me *by* Your generous Spirit. ¹³ *Then* I will teach transgressors Your ways, And sinners shall be converted to You.

¹⁴ Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, The God of my salvation, *And* my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness. ¹⁵ O Lord, open my lips, And my mouth shall show forth Your praise. ¹⁶ For You do not desire sacrifice, or else I would give *it*; You do not delight in burnt offering. ¹⁷ The sacrifices of God *are* a broken spirit, A broken and a contrite heart— These, O God, You will not despise.

¹⁸ Do good in Your good pleasure to Zion; Build the walls of Jerusalem. ¹⁹ Then You shall be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness, With burnt offering and whole burnt offering; Then they shall offer bulls on Your altar.
