

## HOME DEVOTIONS FOR JULY 19-24, 2021

**Monday - Amos 7:10-15** It helps to know that the Hebrews were split North and South, and God sent Amos to denounce both sections for deserting God. That didn't sit well with the archbishop of Bethel (10-11), who forbade Amos use of the royal chapel for his pulpit. "Go home!" (12-13) Amos admitted that he had no skin in the game (14), but since the LORD had signed him up, he had no choice but to obey God's directives (15). What a stout fellow!


**Tuesday - Mark 6:7-13** Miracles are God's power tools; He uses them as needed in the up-building of His Kingdom. People are impressed by miracles; they can carry enough clout to strike Satan out of his stadium (7). Further, God opens hearts and homes for His missionaries (8-10), because most people want to be on God's side, not on Satan's team, a squad of losers (11-13).

**Wednesday - Ephesians 1:3-14** What a great line-up of blessings we have! Even prior to Creation, God chose to adopt us into His family (3-5). Why? Because He is goodhearted and generous (5-6). What else does He accomplish with His love? He transfers to us the value of Jesus' self-sacrifice (7-8) --which is no longer a secret, for He has *made it known* to us that Jesus Christ is the key to God's heart and plans, all the way into His living room (9-14). Praise the Lord!

**Thursday - Psalm 78** God's plans were no secret to ancient Israel, where parents schooled their children in God's Word—Reader's Digest version (12-30). We get choked up to hear how the Hebrews bounced back and forth (over the centuries) between rebellion and repenting, and how God forgave their iniquity over and over again (32-66) until He chose David to shepherd His people. Bottom line: God is greater than anyone would ever expect.

**Friday - Matthew 15:21-28** Jesus took a detour into Philistia, a non-Jewish land, a leftover of heathen Canaan. For what good reason did He do so? To have mercy on that particular woman burdened by love for her suffering child. When Jesus put her love to the test—and the courage of faith, too—she held fast to both, which Jesus expected and rewarded. She depended on Jesus to help her, despite their ethnic difference. [Note: God is not a racist.]

**Saturday - Acts 28:25-31** History does repeat itself, doesn't it? In Paul's day, God opened His heart again and again to people He had selected for great blessing—but His love bounced off them like water off a duck's back (26-27). God could have bottled up His love and never let it breathe again, but He chose a different course – to pour out His love onto all humanity (28). God kept Paul busy *preaching the kingdom of God* to everyone and anyone within earshot. God's love shined into that corner of the world hour after hour, from sunrise to sunset, for two whole years. Amen.

### **EPHESIANS 1:3-14**

<sup>3</sup> Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, <sup>4</sup> just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, <sup>5</sup> having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, <sup>6</sup> to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved.

<sup>7</sup> In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace <sup>8</sup> which He made to abound toward us in all wisdom and prudence, <sup>9</sup> having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself, <sup>10</sup> that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth—in Him. <sup>11</sup> In Him also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will, <sup>12</sup> that we who first trusted in Christ should be to the praise of His glory.

<sup>13</sup> In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, <sup>14</sup> who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory. \*

## **GOSPEL LESSON:**

## **MARK 6:7-13**

[cf. also Matthew 10:1-42; Luke 9:1-6]

<sup>7</sup>And He called the twelve to *Himself*, and began to send them out two by two, and gave them power over unclean spirits. <sup>8</sup>He commanded them to take nothing for the journey except a staff—no bag, no bread, no copper in *their* money belts—<sup>9</sup>but to wear sandals, and not to put on two tunics.

<sup>10</sup>Also He said to them, "In whatever place you enter a house, stay there till you depart from that place. <sup>11</sup>And whoever will not receive you nor hear you, when you depart from there, shake off the dust under your feet as a testimony against them. Assuredly, I say to you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment than for that city!"

<sup>12</sup>So they went out and preached that *people* should repent. <sup>13</sup>And they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick, and healed *them*. \*

## **THE SERMON:**

## **GENESIS 10:1-32**

Now this *is* the genealogy of the sons of Noah: Shem, Ham, and Japheth. And sons were born to them after the flood.

<sup>2</sup>The sons of Japheth *were* Gomer, Magog, Madai, Javan, Tubal, Meshech, and Tiras. <sup>3</sup>The sons of Gomer *were* Ashkenaz, Riphath, and Togarmah.

<sup>4</sup>The sons of Javan *were* Elishah, Tarshish, Kittim, and Dodanim. <sup>5</sup>From these the coastland *peoples* of the Gentiles were separated into their lands, everyone according to his language, according to their families, into their nations.

<sup>6</sup>The sons of Ham *were* Cush, Mizraim, Put, and Canaan. <sup>7</sup>The sons of Cush *were* Seba, Havilah, Sabtah, Raamah, and Sabtechah; and the sons of Raamah *were* Sheba and Dedan.

<sup>8</sup>Cush begot Nimrod; he began to be a mighty one on the earth. <sup>9</sup>He was a mighty hunter before the LORD; therefore it is said, "Like Nimrod the mighty hunter before the LORD." <sup>10</sup>And the beginning of his kingdom was Babel, Erech, Accad, and Calneh, in the land of Shinar. <sup>11</sup>From that land he went to Assyria and built Nineveh, Rehoboth Ir, Calah, <sup>12</sup>and Resen between Nineveh and Calah (that *is* the principal city).

<sup>13</sup>Mizraim begot Ludim, Anamim, Lehabim, Naphtuhim, <sup>14</sup>Pathrusim, and Casluhim (from whom came the Philistines and Caphtorim).

<sup>15</sup>Canaan begot Sidon his firstborn, and Heth; <sup>16</sup>the Jebusite, the Amorite, and the Girgashite; <sup>17</sup>the Hivite, the Arkite, and the Sinite; <sup>18</sup>the Arvadite, the Zemarite, and the Hamathite. Afterward the families of the Canaanites were dispersed. <sup>19</sup>And the border of the Canaanites was from Sidon as you go toward Gerar, as far as Gaza; then as you go toward Sodom, Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboiim, as far as Lasha. <sup>20</sup>These *were* the sons of Ham, according to their families, according to their languages, in their lands *and* in their nations.

<sup>21</sup>And *children* were born also to Shem, the father of all the children of Eber, the brother of Japheth the elder. <sup>22</sup>The sons of Shem *were* Elam, Asshur, Arphaxad, Lud, and Aram. <sup>23</sup>The sons of Aram *were* Uz, Hul, Gether, and Mash. <sup>24</sup>Arphaxad begot Salah, and Salah begot Eber. <sup>25</sup>To Eber were born two sons: the name of one *was* Peleg, for in his days the earth was divided; and his brother's name *was* Joktan. <sup>26</sup>Joktan begot Almodad, Sheleph, Hazarmaveth, Jerah, <sup>27</sup>Hadoram, Uzal, Diklah, <sup>28</sup>Obal, Abimael, Sheba, <sup>29</sup>Ophir, Havilah, and Jobab. All these *were* the sons of Joktan. <sup>30</sup>And their dwelling place was from Mesha as you go toward Sephar, the mountain of the east. <sup>31</sup>These *were* the sons of Shem, according to their families, according to their languages, in their lands, according to their nations.

<sup>32</sup>These *were* the families of the sons of Noah, according to their generations, in their nations; and from these the nations were divided on the earth after the flood. \*
