DAILY BIBLE READINGS FOR DEVOTIONS NOVEMBER 8-13, 2021

Monday - Malachi 4:1-2a The final chapter of the last book of the Old Testament lends itself to the End Times; God leaves no doubt about the purpose and effect of the FIRE, and the fuel feeding the flames is/are **people**. More specifically, those people who are *wickedly* proud against God. On the other hand, those who *revere God* will be warmed (not incinerated) by the *Sunshine* of God's generosity. We say Amen to that, and Hallelujah, too.


Tuesday - John 5:18-24 The nubbin of ungodliness is not trusting God's good judgment when He authorized Jesus to represent Him on Earth (18). How far does Jesus go in representing the Father? Far enough to raise the dead (21) and to preside over Judgment Day (22). The Son deserves the Father's honor, and those who dishonor the Son are dishonoring the Father who delegated Jesus to represent Him (23). [The escape clause follows in v. 24].]

Wednesday - Hebrews 9:24-48 This letter from God clarifies that Jesus is superior to every High Priest by reason of His entering a superior Temple (24) and by His self-sacrifice superseding all other sacrifices (25). That's how the sin-compensation ritual got capped off. Once. For all. So when Jesus shows up on Earth again, it won't be to bear sins but to carry us home (28).

Thursday - Psalm 90 goes straight to God, who is **what He is** from eternity to eternity, who sees where mankind is headed and tries to turn the tide (5) for humans whose time of grace is fleeting (4-6). As for ourselves, because we are rightly *terrified by our iniquities* (7-8), and because our lifespan is soon spent (9-11), *we beg You, O LORD, to have compassion on us*, reform our hearts (14-16), and make our lives count for something worthwhile (17).

Friday - John 10:24-29 How Jesus could be genuinely human and genuinely divine at the same time is a mystery—but we revere Him for what He is, true God and true miracle-worker (24-25). No sense arguing the case with those who have already disowned Jesus (26). Note: When Jesus asserts that His hand keeps us safe just as His Father's hand does (28-29), that leaves no room for doubt about Them working hand-in-hand for our benefit.

Saturday - 1 Peter 3:18-22 Student Peter became Professor Peter, and from his podium he reveals a dark secret – that following upon Good Friday, Jesus in His glorified body took a side trip into enemy territory. Why? In order to provide visible (and audible) proof that He was alive and well, superior to Satan, and could come and go as He wished—no matter where (19). Too late for those lost souls, but not too late for those whom God claims for Himself via the washing of Holy Baptism (20-21). Jesus is in the right position to make it happen. Thank You, dear Lord and Savior!



RESPONSIVE MISSIONS PRAYER

Pastor: Lord Jesus Christ, Lord of the Harvest, we earnestly desire to serve you by proclaiming your Gospel in all Creation. Since we ourselves cannot travel to these places, we support this work in our church body, the Church of the Lutheran Confession. We come to you this day on behalf of our brothers and sisters throughout the world who are one with us in faith and teaching.

We come to you on behalf of the students in our Tanzania CLC Seminary where young men are preparing for their final exams and are schedule to graduate and be ordained as pastors in November.

Congregation: Thank you Lord, for protecting these students, teachers and staff through the challengers of the past year. We ask for Your continued blessings as they finish their formal studies for the Gospel ministry. We further pray that COVID issues don't interfere with their graduation service, seminars and visitations.

Pastor: We come to you on behalf of our brothers and sisters in our Nigeria CLC seminary where two men will graduate.

Congregation: We pray that their labors are successful as well as other outreach efforts in Bayelsa State.

Pastor: Our brothers and sisters in Myanmar face persecution as the military junta there continues to rule with brutality. Protesters have been imprisoned, killed or come up missing. The military has decreed that no public gatherings can take place, and this has kept many Christians from gathering for worship and prayer. Many government offices and services are closed along with banks and institutions. Food and daily necessities are scarce, and prices have skyrocketed.

Congregation: We pray that justice and peace may be restored to Myanmar. We pray especially for our brothers and sisters in Christ that the Lord grant them strength and courage and boldness during these difficult times.

Pastor: Our brothers and sisters in Liberia are enjoying a visit from Pastor John Hein. They are planning seminars in four different locations. They will also conduct a final colloquy with pastors and evangelists who have been studying with Pastor Hein and Pastor Kwiwalazu for the past couple of years.

Congregation: We pray for safe travels for Pastor Hein to and within Liberia. We ask that You give them strength to carry out their work and that those who attend may hear, believe and confess the truths of God's saving Word.

Pastor: Construction on a classroom and small dormitory continues in Togo, with plans for a Bible institute. Togo's Government has continued to enforce travel and meeting restrictions due to COVID. Missionary Evensen is working online translating lessons into French for use in Togo and other nations in Africa.

Congregation: We pray that the Lord blesses the construction work so that classes may begin. We pray that COVID restrictions be lifted or reduced so that the work of the Lord can go forth. We ask the Savior to bless Missionary Evensen's work translating the truths of God's saving word into other languages that others may be prepared to serve in the Gospel Ministry in Togo.

Pastor: The Mission Helper Trip that was cancelled in 2021 is tentatively rescheduled for East Africa in July of 2022.

Congregation: We pray that the Lord would clear any obstacles that stand in the way of this trip and lead young CLC members to apply.

Pastor: Pastor Daniel Mugeni has been studying with CLC missionaries and attending pastoral conferences in Kenya for many years. Missionary Gurath and Board of Doctrine Secretary Andrew Schaller are conducting the formal process of reviewing Pastor Mugeni's doctrinal positions for a possible recommendation for a declaration of fellowship. Pastor Mugeni serves a congregation in Uganda and also cares for several orphan children.

Congregation: We pray that the Lord bless the process of establishing God-pleasing fellowship. We also pray for the children Pastor Mugeni cares for and ask that God grant him the ability to continue to provide their needs.

Pastor: COVID restrictions and Hindu holidays have delayed the progress of building projects in Nepal. They are eager to complete the work that Bible Institute classes may begin in January 2022. They also plan to start more preaching stations in Nepal.

Congregation: We thank the LORD for His blessings on the building project and ask Him to grant patience to Raju and family and students as they await the completion of the building. We further ask that the Spirit of God would bless the proclamation of the Word in Nepal. We also pray for those who hear the Gospel, that they may repent, believe in Jesus and rejoice with us in God's grace and mercy.

Pastor: In Bangladesh, Pastor Montosh asks that we pray for several individuals who have recently converted to Christianity from Hinduism. Since their conversion they have been physically assaulted, persecuted and falsely accused of crimes.

Congregation: We ask the Lord Jesus to protect and defend his new disciples and give them the necessary strength and courage to persevere under persecution.

Pastor: We also pray for all of our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world who are struggling to stay healthy including those in India, Kenya, Zambia, The Democratic Republic of Congo and Mexico.

Congregation: Lord Jesus be with them and grant them health according to your good and gracious will. If they do not recover, grant them rest in the Father's House.

Pastor: May the LORD God grant us opportunities to proclaim the truths of His saving Word in a variety of ways in different places around the world.

Congregation: Thank the LORD for these opportunities and for the privilege of proclaiming the truth of His saving Word to others. We pray for all of these individuals as they seek to grow in their understanding and be better equipped to spread the Good News of our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.
