BIBLE READINGS FOR DEVOTION – APRIL 18-23, 2022

Monday - Exodus 15:1-11 Easter and Exodus don't seem to belong together, but there's more than one exodus. The enslavement of Hebrews in Egypt resembles other slaveries—such as slavery to Satan and sin. So God's grace and mercy in the Old Testament Exodus foreshadows Jesus' exit from the grave, *dashing that enemy in pieces and overthrowing those that rage against Jesus. Who is like You, O LORD, glorious in holiness, doing wonders!*

Tuesday - John 20: 1-18 Mary panicked; Peter and John were more stable, but none of them figured it out that Jesus was gone because He was alive and fully functional to exit the grave on His own power. So somebody had to connect the dots for them - - which Jesus did first-hand and face-to-face (11-16). We fit the pattern, too. Come quickly, Lord Jesus, face-to-face with us!

Wednesday - Colossians 3:1-4 We are like Jesus in that we have been raised from the dead, too (1). From that starting point, much of *our life lies hidden* beyond our vision and our sensory faculties. [Just as atoms, electricity, gravity, and magnetism are puzzles to scientists.] But when Jesus comes back into the framework of our space-time continuum, then *we also will appear with Him, side-by-side and hand-in-hand, in glory.* Amen? Hallelujah!

Thursday - Isaiah 25:6-9 God put Isaiah into a projection booth above the theater audience and let him enlighten his generation with God's grace for exiled Semites. Then the LORD reeled off His scenario for all generations yet to be born -- a time of prosperity for everyone (6-7) with Easter blessings lasting to Judgment Day (8)--thus prompting our response of expectant faith (9).

Friday - Luke 24:1-12 *Perplexed, afraid, and disbelieving* are momentary responses especially when we face the unknown. So when we face the anomaly of His apex miracle, God pokes us to *remember how He spoke to us when He was still in Galilee, saying, 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.'* May God's Holy Spirit turn our momentary weaknesses into trusting His Word on this subject.

Saturday - 1 Corinthians 15:51-57 God confronts us with His plans and deeds via the Holy Bible, where we have His word on it that *Christ died for our sins*, exactly as He had promised throughout the centuries. Otherwise, it's all a *mystery* to us. Since Jesus safely and wonderfully exited the other side of the cemetery, God promises to do the same for us. Believe it! Trust God's love to use His power, His skill, His resources, His energy, His good-hearted nature, etc., etc. to *give us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.* With all that going for us, we can be *steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord.* Thank You, dear Lord Jesus!

We also greet this day with great joy, for your glorious resurrection from the dead is the receipt proving that the Father was well pleased in Your sacrifice and has accepted it as full payment for our sin and guilt. We stand as forgiven sinners, cleansed by Your Blood. Hallelujah!

All (TLH 189, Sung)

He is arisen! Glorious Word! Now reconciled is God, my Lord; The gates of heav'n are open. My Jesus did triumphant die, And Satan's arrows broken lie, Destroyed hell's direst weapon. Oh, hear What cheer! Christ victorious Riseth glorious, Life He giveth – He was dead, but see, He liveth.

Pastor: But now Christ is risen from the dead.

Congregation: He is the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Pastor: For since by man came death.

Congregation: By man also came the resurrection of the dead.

Pastor: For as in Adam all die.

Congregation: Even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

Pastor: But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits,

Congregation: Afterward those who are Christ's at His coming.

Pastor: Then comes the end,

Congregation: When He delivers the kingdom to God the Father, when He puts an end to all rule and all authority and power.

Pastor: For He must reign till he has put all enemies under His Feet:

Congregation: The last enemy that will be destroyed is death.

me. Brighter scenes will then commence; This shall be my
confidence.

EPISTLE LESSON:

1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-11

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, ²and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. ³For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. ⁹For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. ¹¹Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed. **

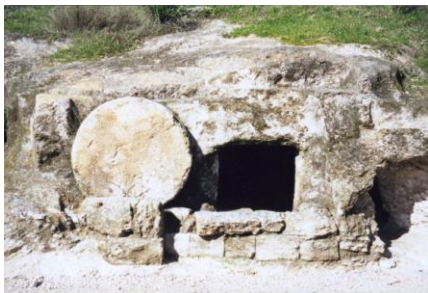
