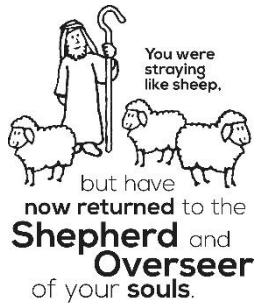

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: EXODUS 32:7-14

⁷And the LORD said to Moses, "Go down, for your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have corrupted themselves. ⁸They have turned aside quickly out of the way that I commanded them. They have made for themselves a golden calf and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!' " ⁹And the LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, and behold, it is a stiff-necked people. ¹⁰Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them, in order that I may make a great nation of you."

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DAILY BIBLE READINGS FOR DEVOTIONS OCTOBER 3-8, 2022

Monday - Luke 17:1-6 Jesus speaks to His disciples, whom He will send out as His apostles: woe to him through whom come stumbling blocks to “little ones” in faith. One way to cause spiritual stumbling would be to withhold forgiveness from one who repents of his sin against you. Forgiveness is the “coin of the realm” in His kingdom and to be used as often as a brother repents. Need greater faith to bring such a loving response? Remember it is not so much the size of our faith, as the power of Him in whom we trust.

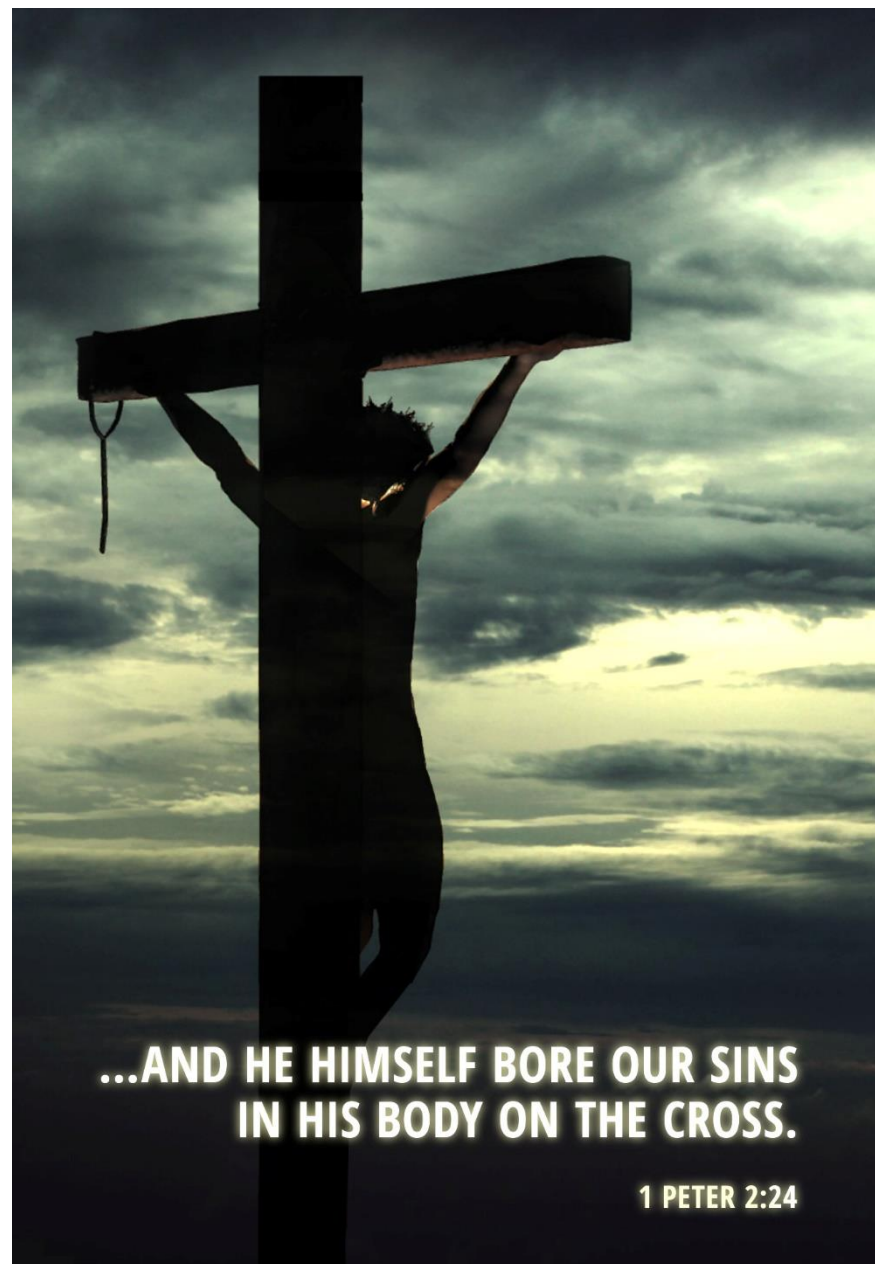
Tuesday - Luke 17:6-10 If God’s people have a faith that works by love, richly forgiving one another, this does not represent anything “extra” done for the Lord, but is the normal fruit of the faith which He planted in His children’s hearts. This too is the LORD’s doing, and marvelous in our eyes (cp. Psalm 118:23).

Wednesday - 2 Thessalonians 1:1-5 Paul’s apostolic band addresses the Thessalonian assembly with grace and peace, giving thanks to God for their growing faith and love, and for their steadfastness in persecutions and afflictions, by which God prepares them for the glory of His kingdom.

Thursday - 2 Thessalonians 1:11-12 If we walk worthy of our calling in Christ, it is God who is making us “worthy of his calling.” Both our holy desires and our works of faith are accomplished by His power and to the glory of Jesus’ name.

Friday - 1 Chronicles 29:1-2,10-13 The LORD moved David to prepare for the building of the Temple which Solomon would carry out. So David offered many supplies for the future building, as did the other leaders of the Israelites (vv6-9). In the face of all this David gives thanks to the LORD, from whom come both honor and riches.

Saturday - 1 Chronicles 29:14-18 David has given gold, silver, iron, wood, precious stones and marble slabs in abundance for the future Temple, but speaks as an “unprofitable servant” (Luke17:10). All the abundance of his and his people’s offerings were gifts from God in the first place, and He it was who put such thoughts and purposes in their hearts.

1 TIMOTHY 1:12-17

But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. ¹⁶ But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. ¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen. **

GOSPEL LESSON:

LUKE 15:1-10

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."

³So he told them this parable: ⁴“What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it?

⁵And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. ⁶And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.’ ⁷Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

⁸“Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it?

⁹And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.’ ¹⁰Just so, I tell you, there is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents.” **

SERMON:

1 PETER 2:18-25, EHV

¹⁸Slaves, submit to your masters with total respect, not only to those who are good and kind but also to those who are harsh. ¹⁹For this is favorable: if a person endures sorrows while suffering unjustly because he is conscious of God. ²⁰For what credit is it to you if you receive a beating for sinning and patiently endure it? But if you suffer for doing good and endure it, this is favorable with God.

²¹Indeed, you were called to do this, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example so that you would follow in his steps. ²²He did not commit a sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth. ²³When he was insulted, he did not insult in return. When he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴He himself carried our sins in his body on the tree so that we would be dead to sins and alive to righteousness. By his wounds you were healed. ²⁵For you were like sheep going astray, but you are now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SACRAMENT:



The Lord's Supper is described in 1 Corinthians 11:23-32 as a most precious medicine for the soul. Like all medicines, of course, it must be used at the right time for the right purpose by the right person, lest it do more harm than good. Those uncomfortable with coming forward and receiving the bread/wine may obtain a single use set from the back table in the fellowship hall.

We ask all visitors to speak to the pastor before taking the sacrament, especially if you have not communed here before. Those who come forward are asked to put out their hands for the bread and choose their own individual cup.

PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

PSALM 51

¹Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. ²Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!

³For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. ⁴Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.

⁵Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me. ⁶Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.

¹⁴Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness. ¹⁵O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. ¹⁶For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. ¹⁷The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

¹⁸Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem;

¹⁹then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar. **

Let this Thy grace enable me steadfastly to walk in the footsteps of my Lord Jesus Christ, nothing doubting that at the last Thou wilt give unto me and to all that bear the cross for His sake the crown of everlasting life.
