OLD TESTAMENT LESSON:

EXODUS 34:29-35

²⁹ When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. ³⁰ Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, and behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses talked with them. ³² Afterward all the people of Israel came near, and he commanded them all that the LORD had spoken with him in Mount Sinai. ³³ And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face.

³⁴ Whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would remove the veil, until he came out. And when he came out and told the people of Israel what he was commanded, ³⁵ the people of Israel would see the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face was shining.

BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS; OCTOBER 24-29, 2022

Monday - Luke 18:18-23 A ruler thinks he has kept all the commandments summed up by “love your neighbor.” Jesus gives him a mirror’s view of himself to see that in his “keeping” of the commandments, his heart was not in it, but in his riches. Thus Jesus’ special word to him made him sad. If our inheriting eternal life were based on our doing, we would all be sad.


Tuesday - Luke 18:24-30 Those blessed with or striving for earthly goods are at risk for treasuring the goods above the Giver and source of all good. “For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also” (Luke 12:34). But God still wins the hearts of people through His own Son, whom He loves.

Wednesday - 1 John 2:15-17 The apostle contrasts the love of the world (lust, desires, pride) with the love of the Father. The former things pass away, but the Father abides forever. In connection with Him is lasting treasure!

Thursday - Deuteronomy 10:12-22 Forty years in the wilderness have passed, and the Children of Israel stand poised to enter the land of promise. Moses reminds them of what the LORD has done for them, how He loves them, and knows what is best for them. He urges them to give God their hearts, to love one another as He has loved them, and to depend on His promises.

Friday - 1 Kings 3:5-14 The LORD comes to young Solomon in a dream and invites him to request something from Him. Solomon prays for wisdom to lead God’s chosen people (v8). God is pleased that he first sought this, and answers that He will give him riches and honor as well.

Saturday - John 15:1-8 Being connected to Jesus, the vine, gives life to the branch and strength to bear fruit, which is also connected to the vine through the branches. Remaining connected to Him is finally all that is needed, for every need is provided through Him (v7).



MISSION FESTIVAL

Calvary Lutheran Church October 23, 2022

In the July Council/Voter's Meetings, Pastor Schaller presented the first of a number of suggested changes to the Calvary church constitution. The first change was passed unanimously. Pastor Schaller suggested that a memorial plaque be purchased to note gifts given in memory.

Treasurer's Report –

It was noted that John Gummerus transferred \$16,000 from the Memorial Funds to the General Fund for the Parsonage Windows. No check has been written to Stonehouse Windows because there is currently no contract/invoice. Mrs. Patricia Lois Johns has asked that the remaining amount in Milton Johns Memorial Account (\$696) be put toward the parsonage windows. It was decided that we no longer contract Spodek Construction for snow removal this winter. It is thought that we will remove snow inhouse.

Financial Secretary's Report –

Mr. Brendon Ewers gave a separate financial report which is available from him.

Building and Grounds Report –

Mr. Robert Basal has been replacing the emergency lighting and security lighting at the church. He has repaired the concrete ramp and the lawn mower.

EPISTLE LESSON:

2 CORINTHIANS 3:1-11

Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Or do we need, as some do, letters of recommendation to you, or from you? ²You yourselves are our letter of recommendation, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all. ³And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

⁴Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God. ⁵Not that we are sufficient in ourselves to claim anything as coming from us, but our sufficiency is from God, ⁶who has made us sufficient to be ministers of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit. For the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

⁷Now if the ministry of death, carved in letters on stone, came with such glory that the Israelites could not gaze at Moses' face because of its glory, which was being brought to an end, ⁸will not the ministry of the Spirit have even more glory? ⁹For if there was glory in the ministry of condemnation, the ministry of righteousness must far exceed it in glory. ¹⁰Indeed, in this case, what once had glory has come to have no glory at all, because of the glory that surpasses it. ¹¹For if what was being brought to an end came with glory, much more will what is permanent have glory. **

GOSPEL LESSON:

JOHN 5:31-47

³¹ If I alone bear witness about myself, my testimony is not true. ³² There is another who bears witness about me, and I know that the testimony that he bears about me is true. ³³ You sent to John, and he has borne witness to the truth. ³⁴ Not that the testimony that I receive is from man, but I say these things so that you may be saved. ³⁵ He was a burning and shining lamp, and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light. ³⁶ But the testimony that I have is greater than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to accomplish, the very works that I am doing, bear witness about me that the Father has sent me. ³⁷ And the Father who sent me has himself borne witness about me. His voice you have never heard, his form you have never seen, ³⁸ and you do not have his word abiding in you, for you do not believe the one whom he has sent.

3. It brings the Savior's righteousness Our souls to robe in royal dress; From all our guilt it brings release And gives the troubled conscience peace.

4. It is the power of God to save From sin and Satan and the grave; It works the faith, which firmly clings To all the treasures which it brings.

5. It bears to all the tidings glad And bids their hearts no more be sad; The heavy-laden souls it cheers And banishes their guilty fears.

6. May we in faith its tidings learn Nor thanklessly its blessings spurn; May we in faith its truth confess And praise the Lord our Righteousness! Amen.
