On Thursday, April 26th 1962, Mary Lou was joined to Lloyd Tuyls in a Christian Marriage. Mary Lou and Lloyd made their vows before God in the presence of Pastor Bertram Naumann and the members of St. Paul's Lutheran in Green Garden. Lloyd and Mary Lou shared a special relationship with Pastor Bertram and Alice Naumann. Mary Lou and Lloyd also enjoyed going to country western concerts.

Mary Lou and Lloyd were moved by conscience to leave St. Paul's and become members of Calvary Lutheran Church in Marquette, where she remained a faithful member.

Life is never easy for a child of God this side of heaven, and Mary Lou also experienced pain and suffering. On Tuesday, May 18th, 2010, the Lord Jesus called Lloyd from this earth to Himself in Heaven. In this difficult circumstance, the Savior Jesus comforted Mary Lou with His Word. She rejoiced to know that their parting was temporary because of the suffering, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. In her later years she relied heavily on her neighbor, her 'hired man' Bill Elliot and his wife.

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" She said to Him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world."

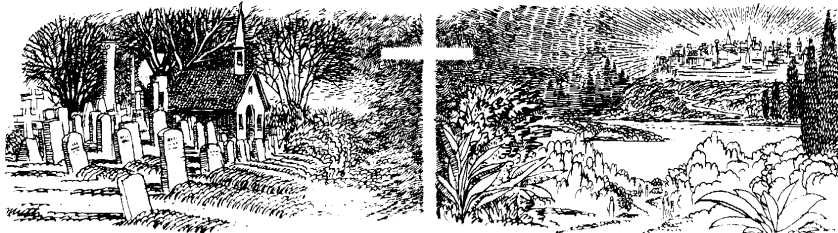

September 1, 1940 – January 5, 2023

On Sunday September 1st 1940, God blessed Henry and Augusta (Dorow) Lewke with the gift of a baby girl, Mary Lou Lewke at St. Luke's Hospital in Marquette, Michigan. She was the youngest of four children with which God blessed Henry and Augusta, including also Ronald, James and Doris.

Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.

The Lord God not only blessed Mary Lou with physical life, but also granted her spiritual life. He granted her spiritual rebirth through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Mary Lou was baptized at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church at Green Garden on Sunday October 20th 1940, by Pastor William Roepke.

God never stops blessing His children, and so the Lord Christ continued to bless Mary Lou. Christ nourished the faith created at her baptism through the hearing of the Word in both worship and Sunday School at St. Paul's Lutheran.

On September 19th 1954, the Lord Jesus also moved Mary Lou to make confession of her faith before Pastor Egbert Albrecht and the membership of St. Paul's Lutheran, Green Garden. Mary Lou learned that God is faithful throughout her life, receiving the Lord's Supper regularly and the Word of God thankfully.

Mary Lou Lewke was raised on a farm down Mangum Road across the street from the Grimes Family. She attended school in Beaver Grove and later in Marquette, graduating from Graveraet High School in 1958. For a time, Mary Lou lived on Arch Street in Marquette with friend Jean Reader (Hill).

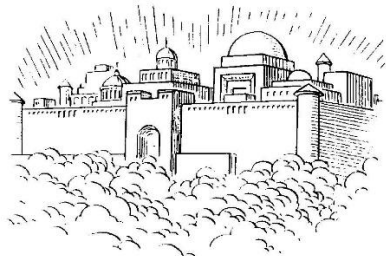
